College Representatives: Representatives visit Mayville High School periodically throughout the year. This is a great opportunity to begin the college search. Times and dates of the visits are posted in the announcements during the week. Get a pass from Mrs. Weyer in the guidance center if you are interested.

Campus Visits: Visiting a campus is the best way to see what university will be the best fit for you! Juniors are encouraged to visit during the second semester. Visit the guidance office for information on how to make arrangements to see the campus. Parents are encouraged to attend.

ACT or SAT College Admission Testing: Juniors should take the college admission test in the spring or summer of their junior year. Registration packets are available in the guidance office. The dates for spring and summer testing for the ACT test are April 3, 2004 and June 12, 2004. Additional information on the ACT and SAT Test can be found on their web sites. College Admission Requirements: Students should check the admission requirements for the university they wish to attend. UW system schools require 3 years of higher level math or more and some require foreign language. **CHECK OUT** the individual campus you are interested in applying to for their specific requirements in the areas of english, math, social science, science, or foreign language.

Grade Point Average and Rank are important factors in the admission process. Be sure you meet the requirements for admission.

Activities Resume: Be sure to begin the list of activities you have been involved in throughout your high school career. This information will be used on your admission application and scholarship applications.

Explore the different options to available to you for post high school options. They include college, the military, and work. Visit the guidance center for more information.

Utilize the guidance center to browse through college catalogs, military catalogs, and exploring work options. Computer stations are available for internet use.

Read the announcements daily for information related to junior scholarships. When scholarship information is available to juniors it will be posted in the daily announcements.
