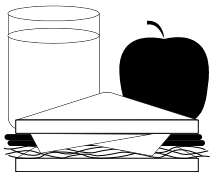

YOUTH OPTIONS is an opportunity for students in grades 11 and 12 currently enrolled in a Wisconsin public high school to attend a post-secondary institution for the purpose of taking one or more courses for high school and college credit. Upon successful completion of a college course, a Mayville High School student will earn $\frac{1}{4}$ of high school credit per college credit. The college course taken must not be comparable to a course offered at the high school. Tuition, books, and fees will be paid by Mayville High School. Students interested in participating in the program need to talk to the high school guidance department and decide on the appropriate course and post-secondary institution.
