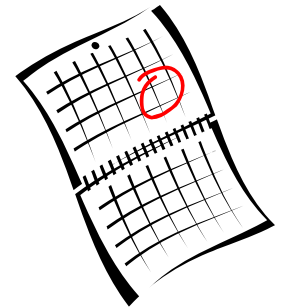


Parking At Parkview
