### SCHOOL DISTRICT MISSION

- (4) A sense of right and wrong that is necessary to live by a moral standard of behavior;
- (5) The ability to live and work in harmony with others; and
- (6) Emotional stability and readiness for life's realities.

The District will then focus its remaining resources and effort on the following additional aspects of the students' education:

- A well-cared for and well-developed body.
- A loyalty to America and the American way of life.
- A sense of civic responsibility and understanding of government.
- Information and guidance for making wise occupational choices.
- Knowledge of world affairs and the interrelationships among people.
- Introduction and exposure to technical and vocational training.

- Management of personal finances and consumer skills.
- Family management and parenting skills.
