SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGAL STATUS

The legal basis for public education in the school district is vested in the will of the people as expressed in the Wisconsin Constitution. Public education is primarily a state responsibility and a local school district's function.

The official name of this school district is the "School District of Mayville". It is classified as a common school district and includes the city of Mayville and the townships of Herman, Hubbard, LeRoy, Lomira, Theresa and Williamstown, and the village of Kekoskee in Dodge County.

Educational services of the District shall be organized as a program of instruction for grades pre-kindergarten through 12. The District shall be operated as a single system by the Board of Education, under the direction of the District Administrator.

The School District of Mayville shall consist of a Primary Learning Center, Intermediate Learning Center, and a Secondary Learning Center. The Board may authorize the District Administrator to establish other special classrooms or programs when necessary.
