

**PARTICIPATION OF HOME-BASED AND NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN
DISTRICT COURSES AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
POLICY**

424 Policy

Home-based and non-public school students may participate in School District of Mayville public school courses and activities as outlined below:

High School Courses

A home-based or non-public school student may take up to two (2) high school courses per semester without altering their home-based/non-public school status, provided the following conditions are met:

1. The student is eligible for high school admission (grades 9-12).
2. The student's parent/guardian has applied for admission to the course(s) in writing stating a rationale for the request.
3. The student resides in the District.
4. There is sufficient space in the course section/class.
5. The student is eligible for District high school course offerings only (e.g. Youth Options, etc. are not considered high school course offerings).
6. The student is assessed and pays all fees in accordance with District policy for high school admissions.

High School Co-Curricular Activities

The District shall allow home-based/non-public school students to participate in District co-curricular activities under the following conditions:

1. The co-curricular activity is a non-WIAA sports (e.g. intramurals) and non-leadership co-curricular activity (e.g. Student Council, Class and Club officer roles).
2. There is space in the co-curricular activity for additional student participation.
3. The student is enrolled in at least two (2) high school courses during the semester in which the co-curricular activity is in place.
4. The student maintains academic eligibility as outlined in the District Co-Curricular Code (Rule 370).
5. The student is assessed and pays all fees in accordance with District policy for the co-curricular activity.
6. The student complies with all rules and regulations in place for other full-time students involved in the co-curricular activity as outlined in the District Co-Curricular Code (Rule 370) (eg. Health physical, etc.)

Co-curricular activities currently open to high school home-based/non-public school students include all those itemized in the District Co-Curricular Code (Rule 370). Transportation eligibility will also follow criteria established in Rule 370. Certain co-curricular activities will require admission based on audition and/or participation in a related high school course as determined by the co-curricular advisor and building administrator. Additional costs/expenses to accommodate the student shall not be incurred by the District.

Elementary and Middle School Courses

A home-based or non-public school student may participate in middle school courses per the

approval of the building administrator and per the following conditions:

1. The student is eligible for elementary and middle school admission (grades K-8).
2. The student's parent/guardian has applied for admission to the course subject in writing stating a rationale for the request.
3. The student resides in the District.
4. There is sufficient space in the course/class.
5. The student is assessed and pays all fees in accordance with District policy for high school admissions.

Elementary and Middle School Co-Curricular Activities

Home-based and non-public school students are allowed to participate in middle school co-curricular activities without being required to participate in school day middle school course offerings, provided:

1. The co-curricular activity is a non-leadership co-curricular activity (e.g. Student Council, Class and Club officer roles).
2. There is space in the co-curricular activity.
3. The student is assessed and pays all fees in accordance with District policy for the co-curricular activity.
4. The student complies with all rules and regulations in place for other full-time students involved in the co-curricular activity.
5. The student maintains academic eligibility as outline in the District Co-Curricular Code (Rule 370).

Middle school non-public school students are allowed to participate in middle school co-curricular activities provided the activity is not offered by their non-public school of attendance and reside in the district.
