SAFETY PROGRAM

The Board of Education shall take every reasonable precaution for the safety of the students, staff, visitors, patrons and all others having business with the District. The Board believes that school safety is important to everyone concerned with the School District of Mayville.

The District, in its efforts to provide a safe and healthful environment for students, staff and others utilizing the schools, adopts these District-wide safety goals:

- To comply with all applicable local, state and federal safety laws and regulations.
- To inspect all classrooms and facilities for potential hazards to health and safety, and to correct all hazardous conditions in a timely manner.
- To provide maintenance and custodial services in such a manner that the safety and health of all students, staff and visitors are protected.
- To provide training to maintenance employees so they may perform maintenance procedures and custodial services safely and in compliance with state, federal and local laws and regulations. To provide training as needed regarding fire extinguisher use, evacuation procedures and tornado safety.
- To develop an effective information and education program regarding accident prevention, fire prevention, emergency response procedures, and other appropriate safety programs and measures.

The Director of Operations is designated as the District Safety Coordinator and is responsible for coordinating safety practices throughout the District. The responsibility for school building safety is assigned to each building principal, in conjunction with the Director of Operations.

A school safety plan shall be developed and in effect in each school in the District. Each school safety plan shall be developed consistent with District policies and legal requirements, and shall be reviewed and updated on a regular basis. District employees shall receive a copy of the school safety plan for their assigned school. A copy of each school safety plan shall also be filed in the District Office.

The Director of Operations shall establish a District Safety Committee, which will include teachers, support staff, parents, custodial staff and administrators. The District Safety Committee shall: (1) discuss unsafe conditions and practices; (2) determine and make recommendations for improved school safety and security measures, (3) annually review and make recommendations regarding school safety plans and the District's crisis response booklet, and (4) plan, develop and assist in presenting safety program inservices for the staff. The District Safety Committee shall meet at least quarterly. All Safety Committee reports and recommendations shall be monitored with appropriate actions planned and/or recommended for Board approval.
