**REGISTRATION**

Summer School registration will be held at the High School Cafeteria:

- Saturday, April 17                      8:00 AM – Noon
- Monday, April 19                      5:00 PM - 7:00 PM

Forms will be dated the day they are received. Priority will be given to those who register first.

**Please understand there will be a registration deadline adhered to this summer.  
No registrations will be accepted after April 30th .**

If you are unable to attend the scheduled registration dates you must register in person at the Administration Building located at 234 North John Street. Staff will be available from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. from Tuesday, April 20th through Friday, April 30th . **No registrations will be accepted after April 30th .**

**FEES**

**All fees are due upon registration.** A \$25.00 fee per student will be charged for academic and enrichment subjects for students who reside in the Mayville School District. *Non-resident fees are doubled.*

**GRADE LEVEL OF SELECTION**

Students are to choose classes that are for the grade they are **now** completing (i.e. If your child just completed Grade 2, they must choose only classes that are listed for Grade 2, or Grades 2-3).

**CLASS TIMES**

**Summer school classes for PK-8 are offered Monday through Friday, from June 21st through July 16<sup>th</sup>. (No School on July 5th)**

**SCHEDULING OF CLASSES**

Classes will run for four weeks. Students must be enrolled in a class to be able to stay on school grounds. **If a student does not have a full schedule, they must leave the school grounds during the time period(s) they are not enrolled.** Classes will be limited to minimum/maximum number of students. Classes will be filled on a first come basis. *If a class is dropped due to lack of enrollment, you will be notified of any changes.*

**ATTENDANCE/ABSENCES**

Attendance is expected by all students that sign up for summer school. Students should be in attendance for all chosen classes. Students enrolled in summer school may not have more than **3 unexcused absences**. Excused absences consist of family vacation, illness, or other emergency as deemed excusable by the Summer School Coordinator. Please **inform** the school office by calling 387-7970 Ext. 203 between 7:30 AM – 9:00 AM, or by writing a note the morning **prior** to the day of absence.

**BEHAVIOR**

Our goal is to provide for each student an atmosphere that is a safe and enjoyable learning experience. To ensure that this occurs, all Middle School policies for proper behavior will be adhered to by all students. The student's conduct will be established on their first day of summer school. The following consequences will result should problems arise:

- A) First offense will result in written warning sent home from Summer School Coordinator/or teacher and must be returned signed by parent the next day.
- B) Second offense will result in a conference with student, parent, teacher, school principal, and Summer School Coordinator to discuss the consequence and how behavior might be improved.
- C) Third offense will result in a conference with those above, followed by dismissal from all summer school classes for the remainder of the summer school.

Soda and food will not be allowed to be consumed in the classroom or hallways. Gum will not be allowed at any time.

**BUS SERVICE**

**Daily Bus Service.** Busses will arrive at Mayville Middle School at 7:45 AM and leave at 12:15 PM. Students choosing round trip bus transportation must enroll and attend all morning to include the total time between buses. Students may ride the bus one way if parents provide an alternate means of transportation. Check proper place on the registration forms if you desire bus service.

**A shuttle bus does travel to Parkview at arranged times** for entering Kindergarten classes. It will depart and arrive in the parking lot.

**ENTERING/EXITING MIDDLE SCHOOL**

**Students** being dropped-off/picked-up or riding bikes must enter/leave by main entrance located by office. Students being bussed are to enter by the cafeteria. Walkers may enter/leave by either entrance. **Only students enrolled will be allowed to attend classes, no visitors.**

**Non-students.** All parents, adults or non-summer school students may enter only at the main entrance. Any of the above persons entering the building must stop at main office to pickup child or to receive a "visitor pass." After receiving a visitor's pass, visitors should proceed directly to that child's classroom.

**Early Bird Students.** No students will be allowed in school before 7:50 AM. On rainy days students will be able to enter by 7:45 AM and wait in the entrance areas. No one should arrive more than ten minutes prior to the start of his or her first class. Students arriving early must sit quietly on carpeted steps outside of the school office.

### **BIKE RIDERS**

Students riding bikes must be alert at all times for cars dropping off students, buses and other students walking. Bikes **must** be walked up the driveway and parked in the bike racks by the main entrance. Bikes may not be ridden on parking lot, playground areas, or sidewalks at any time during summer school hours. Misuse of bikes on school grounds may result in loss of privilege of having it on school grounds. The use of skateboards, roller blades, and scooters are not allowed on school grounds.

### **PICK-UP'S & DROP OFF'S**

Parents dropping off or picking up students should use the entrance/exit on the parking lot side of the school. The driveway by the main entrance is not to be used between 7:00 AM and 12:30 PM and is reserved for buses. Please drive slowly and be aware of any students walking to and from school or class activity that may be taking place.

### **REMEMBER TO CHECK**

- ✓ That all information is completed and printed neatly.
- ✓ Do you need bus service? Check proper area.
- ✓ That you have all periods checked you plan to attend.
- ✓ That the extra form is filled out for your records and kept close to your phone.
  - Does your child have **more than one choice** per period on the home form just in case a change is necessary?
  - **Do not mark** second choice on the form you turn in.

**Grades: 3**

**Around the World with Food and Fun**

**Grade: 3**

Celebrate culture by exploring heritage at Mayville Middle School and throughout the world. We will taste food from other countries and cultures, create crafts like a Chinese lantern, a Spanish piñata, and a German pinwheel.

**Baseball Skills**

**Grade:3**

This class is designed to teach the basic skills associated with the game of baseball while having fun at the same time.

**Book Cooks**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

You will read a book and then complete various activities dealing with the story, including cooking! Cooking projects provide a highly motivating, real-life situation for learning which will enhance your reading and math skills. You will learn about foods from other countries as you participate in the literature and cooking experiences provided in this class.

**Boy's Basketball**

**Grade: 3**

This course will emphasize offensive skills of shooting, ball-handling and passing. Skills taught will have a carry-over impact for future years. All students/players will have the same number of reps and teaching.

**Butterflies**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

Research butterflies using books, the internet, and studying real butterflies at their various stages of life. Students will put together a slide show using Power Point to present everything they've learned about butterflies.

**Co-ed Basketball (Class will be limited to 50 Students)**

**Grade: 2**

This course will emphasize offensive skills of shooting, ball-handling and passing. Skills taught will have a carry-over impact for future years. All students/players will have the same number of reps and teaching.

**Dinosaurs**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

Step back in time a million or more years ago to the wonderful world of extinct plants and animals. You will participate in activities and discussion about dinosaurs.

**Fun and Games (Class limit of 20 students)**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

This active class is designed to help you develop your motor skills and build a positive self-image toward physical activities. Activities will be performed in a non-competitive setting. **Gym shoes required.**

**Game Masters (Class limit of 20 students)**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

Students develop their knowledge of rules and strategies for playing board games. Games include Dominos, Tri-ominos, Mahjong, checkers and others.

**Girl's Basketball**

**Grade: 3**

This course will emphasize offensive skills of shooting, ball-handling and passing. Skills taught will have a carry-over impact for future years. All students/players will have the same number of reps and teaching.

**Harry Potter**

**Grade 2 & 3**

Each week, we will explore a different book of the Harry Potter series through reading and projects. On the final week, we will plan and implement a game of Quidditch.

**Kids in the Kitchen**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

You will learn cooking terms, and how to figure out measurements. Come discover the world of cook books. Become a master chef as you will test these new recipes.

**Kids Pics**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

This graphics program is designed to allow students to design their own stamps, animations, and other graphic designs.

**Multi-Media Sculpture**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

Student will have the chance to work with materials to make sculptures. Some of the materials used would be model magic, paper sculpture, wood sculpture, printing, wire, soap, weaving. This will give your student a chance to work 3d instead of only painting or drawing.

**Phy. Ed. Fun**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

This highly active class will keep you moving with a variety of Phy. Ed. Games and activities.

**Rainforest**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

You will become aware of the value of the rain forests in today's world. You will travel to several continents and learn who lives there. Pack your bags.

**Sign Language (Class limit of 20 students)**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

Do you want to learn to talk with your mouth full? In Sign Language class, you will learn how facial expressions and body language carry a message. Students will learn the manual alphabet and core vocabulary for action words, animals, colors, foods, and school language. We'll also learn how to sing the Happy Birthday song in sign. Aspects of Deaf culture and equipment used by deaf or hard of hearing people will also be presented.

**Spanish**

**Grade: 2 & 3**

**Grades: 3**
