

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

REGISTRATION

Summer School registration will be held at the High School Cafeteria:

- Saturday, April 17th 8:00 AM – Noon
- Monday, April 19th 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM

Forms will be dated the day they are received. Priority will be given to those who register first.

Please understand there will be a registration deadline adhered to this summer. No registrations will be accepted after April 30th.

If you are unable to attend the scheduled registration dates you must register in person at the Administration Building located at 234 North John Street. Staff will be available from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. from Tuesday, April 20th through Friday, April 30th . **No registrations will be accepted after April 30th.**

FEES

All fees are due upon registration. A \$25.00 fee per student will be charged for academic and enrichment subjects for students who reside in the Mayville School District. *Non-resident fees are doubled.*

GRADE LEVEL OF SELECTION

Students are to choose classes that are for the grade they are **now** completing (i.e. If your child just completed Grade 4, they must choose only classes that are listed for Grade 4, or (Grades 4 & 5).

CLASS TIMES

Summer school classes for PK-8 are offered Monday through Friday, from June 21st through July 16th. (No School on July 5th)

SCHEDULING OF CLASSES

Classes will run for four weeks. Students must be enrolled in a class to be able to stay on school grounds. **If a student does not have a full schedule, they must leave the school grounds during the time period(s) they are not enrolled.** Classes will be limited to minimum/maximum number of students. Classes will be filled on a first come basis. *If a class is dropped due to lack of enrollment, you will be notified of any changes.*

ATTENDANCE/ABSENCES

Attendance is expected by all students that sign up for summer school. Students should be in attendance for all chosen classes. Students enrolled in summer school may not have more than **3 unexcused absences**. Excused absences consist of family vacation, illness, or other emergency as deemed excusable by the Summer School Coordinator. Please **inform** the school office by calling 387-7970 Ext. 203 between 7:30 AM – 9:00 AM, or by writing a note the morning **prior** to the day of absence.

BEHAVIOR

Our goal is to provide for each student an atmosphere that is a safe and enjoyable learning experience. To ensure that this occurs, all Middle School policies for proper behavior will be adhered to by all students. The student's conduct will be established on their first day of summer school. The following consequences will result should problems arise:

- A) First offense will result in written warning sent home from Summer School Coordinator/or teacher and must be returned signed by parent the next day.
- B) Second offense will result in a conference with student, parent, teacher, school principal, and Summer School Coordinator to discuss the consequence and how behavior might be improved.
- C) Third offense will result in a conference with those above, followed by dismissal from all summer school classes for the remainder of the summer school.

Soda and food will not be allowed to be consumed in the classroom or hallways. Gum will not be allowed at any time.

BUS SERVICE

Daily Bus Service. Busses will arrive at Mayville Middle School at 7:45 AM and leave at 12:15 PM. Students choosing round trip bus transportation must enroll and attend all morning to include the total time between buses. Students may ride the bus one way if parents provide an alternate means of transportation. Check proper place on the registration forms if you desire bus service.

A shuttle bus does travel to Parkview at arranged times entering Kindergarten classes. It will depart and arrive in the parking lot.

ENTERING/EXITING MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students being dropped-off/picked-up or riding bikes must enter/leave by main entrance located by office. Students being bussed are to enter by the cafeteria. Walkers may enter/leave by either entrance. Only students enrolled will be allowed to attend classes, **no visitors**.

Non-students. All parents, adults or non-summer school students may enter only at the main entrance. Any of the above persons entering the building must stop at main office to pickup child or to receive a "visitor pass." After receiving a visitor's pass, visitors should proceed directly to that child's classroom.

Early Bird Students. No students will be allowed in school before 7:50 AM. On rainy days students will be able to enter by 7:45 AM and wait in the entrance areas. No one should arrive more than ten minutes prior to the start of his or her first class. Students arriving early **must** sit quietly on carpeted steps outside of the school office.

BIKE RIDERS

Students riding bikes must be alert at all times for cars dropping off students, buses and other students walking. Bikes **must** be walked up the driveway and parked in the bike racks by the main entrance. Bikes may not be ridden on parking lot, playground areas, or sidewalks at any time during summer school hours. Misuse of bikes on school grounds may result in loss of privilege of having it on school grounds. The use of skateboards, roller blades, and scooters are not allowed on school grounds.

PICK-UP'S & DROP OFF'S

Parents dropping off or picking up students should use the entrance/exit on the parking lot side of the school. The driveway by the main entrance is not to be used between 7:00 AM and 1:00 PM and is reserved for buses. Please drive slowly and be aware of any students walking to and from school or class activity that may be taking place.

REMEMBER TO CHECK

- ✓ That all information is completed and printed neatly.
- ✓ Do you need bus service? Check proper area.
- ✓ That you have all periods checked you plan to attend.
- ✓ That the extra form is filled out for your records and kept close to your phone.
 - Does your child have **more than one choice** per period on the home form just in case a change is necessary?
 - **Do not mark** second choice on the form you turn in.

Baseball Skills

Grade:3

This class is designed to teach the basic skills associated with the game of baseball while having fun at the same time.

Baseball Fever

Grade: 4 & 5

We will look at various aspects of baseball. Students will learn about the history of baseball including famous players. We will do literature circles as well. Students will use their math skills as well as their artistic ability in this class.

Boy’s Basketball

This class is for students who have already mastered the basic skill of knitting.

Making a Newspaper

Grade 4 & 5

Learn the ins and the outs of putting together printed media by visiting a local newspaper, talking to a reporter, and discovering what is all in a newspaper. We will then publish a personal paper to be taken home.

Model Building

Grade: 4-5

You will learn the steps needed to successfully put a model together, whether it's a car, plane, ship, spaceship....Your finished project should be just like the real one. **Only requirement is to bring you own model(s) on the first day of class.**

Phy. Ed. Fun

Grade: 4 & 5

This highly active class will keep you moving with a variety of Phy. Ed. Games and activities.

Power Point

Grade: 5

Student will learn the basic fundamentals of Microsoft Power Point and learn the basics of making presentations using the Power Point software. This program is used often for many school assignments and this course provides and opportunity to learn and use this very exciting program.

Private/Small Group Band Lessons 12:00 p.m. -2:00 p.m.

These lessons are intended for **students currently in grades 5-12**. Students will receive one 20-minute lesson per week during the weeks that summer school is in session. Lessons are scheduled in the afternoon. Summer lessons are encouraged because they will help students to progress faster on their instrument. Read any Good Books Lately?

Grade: 4 & 5

Cuddle up with a good book and simply enjoy the adventure the words take you on as you read the books you have always wanted to read but didn't have enough time too. Class begins with a read aloud mini-lesson, followed by an uninterrupted reading time (Bring your favorite stuffed animal or pillow to keep you company), and concludes with a group sharing of what you read.

Science Secrets

Grade: 4 & 5

Explore chemistry, geology and botany as you experiment with ordinary stuff found at home. Learn the scientific method of planning and researching before the experiment, recording data, and the forming of a conclusion based on your observation of the experiment.

Sewing

Grade: 4 & 5

You will do cross stitch and/or other sewing activities that your imagination can create.

Spanish

Grade: 4 & 5
